Three Card Poker

Three Card Poker 6 Card Bonus is an exciting stud poker game! You may bet against the dealer, bet on the value of your own three card hand, or bet both. Bonus payouts may be had for certain hands when wagering against the Dealer. Bet the 6 Card Bonus to win on your best 5-Card Hand.

The Bet



Each Player plays against the Dealer, and Players place an Ante wager to receive three card facedown. Players may also make an optional Pair Plus and/or 6-Card Bonus wager at the time of the Ante wager. A Player can only place a 6-Card Bonus wager if they place a Pair Plus wager.

Ante Wager

Ante lets you play against the Dealer's Hand. It's just your cards against the Dealer's. If you bet Ante and like your hand, you must place an equal wager on the Play spot. It's your 3-Card Poker Hand against the Dealer's 3-Card Poker Hand, and the Best Hand wins! (Dealer must have a Queen High or better to qualify)

Ante Bonus Wager

Straight Flush......5 to 1 Three of a Kind......4 to 1 Straight......1 to 1

Optional Wagers

Pair Plus Wager

Pair Plus lets you bet against your own hand. If your hand contains a pair or better, you win! Pair Plus Odds:

6 Card Bonus Wager

Combine your 3-Card Hand with the Dealer's 3-Card Hand to make your best 5-Card Poker Hand. You win with Three-of-a-Kind or better.

6 Card Bonus Odds:


All the Players below placed Ante, Pair Plus and 6-Card Bonus Wagers.



The Deal

Hands are dealt to the first position (to the Dealer's immediate left) and continuing clockwise. The Dealer also receives three cards face-down.





The Play

The object of Three Card Poker is to have a better poker hand than the Dealer. The Players examine their cards and decide whether or not they want to play. If they do not think their cards are good enough to play against the Dealer, they can fold their hand and surrender their Ante and Bonus wagers. If they like their cards, the Player places their hand face-down and can place an additional Raise bet on top.

In the Image below, all the Players chose to play and placed an additional Raise bet on top.



Once the Players have finished placing their Raise bets, the Dealer collects any folded cards and the Ante, Flush, and Straight Flush Bonus wagers of all the Players that immediately folded.

Once the Dealer has collected all the folded Player cards, the Dealer reveals their cards.



The Dealer is only allowed to play with a hand that has at least a Queen High or better. If the Dealer's Hand does not meet or exceed these qualifications, it is a Push and the Dealer pays out all Ante wagers with a 1-to-1 payout and neither the Player nor the Dealer wins the Bonus wagers.

In the image below, the Dealer has a pair of 6s while the Right Player only has a King High.



A pair always beats 3 Singles, so the Dealer wins and collects the Right Player's Ante, Raise, Pair Plus, and 6-Card Bonus wagers.



Next, the Middle Right Player has a 3-of a Kind while the Dealer only has a pair.



A 3-of-a-Kind always beats a pair, so the Right Middle Player wins and the Right Middle Player gets 1-to-1 payout on his Ante and Raise wagers, as well as 30-to-1 payout on his Pair Plus wager and 5-to-1 payout on his 6-Card Bonus Wager.



Next, the Middle Left Player has a Diamond Flush, while the Dealer only has a pair.



A Flush always beats a pair, so the Middle Left Player wins and the Middle Left Player gets 1-to-1 payout on his Ante and Raise wagers. He also gets a 3-to-1 payout on his Pair Plus wager and 15-to-1 payout on his 6-Card Bonus Wager because his 3 Diamonds combined with the Dealer's 6 of Diamonds and Queen of Diamonds gives the Middle Left Player a 5-Card Flush.



Finally, the Left Player and the Dealer both have pairs, but the Left Player's has a pair of 8s while the Dealer has a pair of 6s, so the Left Player wins the Hand.



The Left Player wins a 1-to-1 payout for his Ante and Raise wagers, as well as a 1-to-1 payout for his Pair Plus wager. He doesn't qualify for a 6-Card Bonus Wager so he loses that wager.



After the Dealer pays out all the wagers and collects all the cards, he clears his own Hand, and is ready for the next Hand.
